Stonehouse Parish: Tithe Survey 1839 and 1841Census

This study has identified the ownership and occupiers of buildings bordering the canal in Stonehouse in 1839 using the Tithe survey. A small amount of additional information has been taken from the 1841 census for Stonehouse.

Stroud Canal Company owned 357 Ryeford Lock House, occupier William Musty

1841 Census for Stonehouse

Occupiers provisionally assigned to houses: folio numbers recto/verso refer to enumeration book, plain numbers to tithe map.

Stonehouse Court and farm, mills (Bonds, Lower, Upper, Ryeford, Oil, Ebley) and mill housing: no direct canal links among occupiers, who are mainly cloth workers. One waterman listed [f62v at Cainscross 27] John Purnell aged 20.

Dudbridge canalside cottage f65v

Thomas Harper aged 40, haulier, Elizabeth Harper aged 40, Mary Whatley aged 35.

Cainscross canalside house f69r

Ebenezer Durden aged 29, manufacturer [unclear], Mary Durden, aged 20, Henry Durden, aged 1, Mary Hawkins aged 50, independent, Henry Durden aged 12, Mary Ayland aged 20, female servant.

Dudbridge houses f67rv

All the houses shown here on the OS map 1885 were built on land in Eastington parish, and could be investigated through the tithe map and 1841 census for Eastington.
